### **Feed Back Analysis (2015-16)**

#### **A ) Analysis of feedback of teachers by students :-**

The analysis of feedback on teachers by students is based on general / attitude related and subject oriented aspects and overall impression of a teacher.

The feedback sought from the students to evaluate the followings:

- The ability to create study material, conducive environment and interest created by the teacher in the subject.
- To encourage the students for participation in the process quality enhancement.
- The students were asked to rate the above points in four categories as follows:

##### **Analysis:-**

The analysis of feedback revealed that approximately 71% students were feel excellent about the teaching & communication skill of the teachers and also 24% analyzed students were feel good for the same skills.

The teachers, whom there were suggestions and with lower rate were personally instructed to make improvements.
