Feed Back Analysis (2017-18)

A) Analysis of feedback of teachers by students :-

Introduction & objectives:-

The analysis of feedback on teachers by students is based on general / attitude related and subject oriented aspects and overall impression of a teacher.

Methodology:-

The feedback sought from the students to evaluate the followings:

- The expected knowledge level of the teacher.
- Communication skills
- Commitment level social and subject of the teacher.
- The ability to create study material, conductive environment and interest created by the teacher in the subject.
- To encourage the students for participation in the process quality enhancement.
- The students were asked to rate the above points in four categories as follows:
 - a) Excellent
- b) Good
- c) Satisfactory
- d) Average.

Analysis:-

- 71 % students respond adequate about teacher's preparation and 23 % student response
- 81 % students has given respond excellent about knowledge based foundation of teacher and 21 % remarks found good.
- 78 % student quotes communicative approach of the teacher and 18 % remarks found good.
- 66 % gives teacher awareness about subject interest and social commitment.
- 51 % students responds excellent and 34% good teachers role in competitive exam, cultural program and sports activities rather than curriculum.
- 52% students has given excellent respond of using teaching aids and 36% remarks found good.
- 80 % students say 85% syllabus covered in the class.
- 61% students give remarks excellent about conducting extra classess.
- Near about 70% students are satisfied about the teachers asking short questions in the class.
- Near about 70% students agreed about conducting tests.

Conclusion:-

Averagely above 70 % students are found satisfied on interaction of teacher, completion of syllabus, teacher's preparation, teacher communication and conducting tests.

B) Analysis of feedback of curriculum by students:-

Introduction & objectives:-

A curriculum is a planned programme of activities to achieve the missions and goals of education. The curriculum of Arts, Commerce and Science faculties are designed by the Board of studies of different subjects in the University and are implemented by all the affiliated colleges. The feedback of curriculum by students for Arts, Commerce and Science faculties in the college has been taken.

Methodology:-

The feedback on curriculum sought by the students to evaluate the following:-

- The impact of the course content.
- Opinion about Library, Laboratory, Classroom, Sports, NSS, Hostel, Drinking water and services to the students
- Learning values and utility of regarding materials.
- The inclusion of syllabus as knowledge based, conceptional, clarity and utility.
- The students were asked to rate the above points in four categories as follows:
 - b) Excellent
- b) Good
- c) Satisfactory
- d) Average.

Analysis:-

- 52% students' gives opinion as adequate about library facilities and 45% student's gives opinion as adequate about classroom and laboratories.
- 62% students remarks Excellent about Sports and NSS facilities.
- 44% student's response Excellent about process of administrative office, hostel and drinking water.
- Averagely 70% students' remarks easy about the clarity, utility and understandable syllabus.
- 13% students taken efforts about the success of curriculum.
- 40% students give Excellent about learning value of course.
- The student from all disciplines gives feedback for overall rating is 40% Excellent.

Conclusion:-

From the above given feedback data it is concluded that above 70% students gives remarks easy about clarity, understandable and utility of textual reading material 13% a very few students, that is 13% has taken efforts to the complete the curriculum
